How does the proposed course specifically address the Foundational Component Area definition above?

This course focuses on how religion is practiced throughout the world and how those practices shape--and are shaped by--the cultures they interact with. This includes a survey of the tenets, practices, and rituals of some of the world's religious traditions as well as a critical understanding of religious studies as a discipline.

Core Objectives:

Critical Thinking (to include creative thinking, innovation, inquiry, and analysis, evaluation and synthesis of information):

Students will engage in several activities to meet the critical thinking core objective, including: writing two reflection papers and creating and delivering a poster about a current event in religion. Each of these will require students to analyze, evaluate, and synthesize information.

Communication (to include effective development, interpretation and expression of ideas through written, oral and visual communication):

Students will engage in several activities to meet the communication core objective, including: writing 2 reflection papers and preparing a poster and giving a 5 minute presentation on the poster. The two reflection papers draw on the written communication component while the poster and poster presentation draw on all three areas of communication. Additionally, students have team projects throughout the semester, which requires good team communication; students will evaluate their teammates at two points during the semester.

Social Responsibility (to include intercultural competence, knowledge of civic responsibility, and the ability to engage effectively in regional, national, and global communities):

Students will engage in several activities to meet the social responsibility core objective, including: writing two reflection papers and creating a poster and delivering a presentation of the poster. In all cases, students are expected to reflect on culturally-informed perspectives. Reflection paper 1 asks students to reflect on how their understanding of religion and religious studies has changed since taking the course. Reflection paper 2 asks students to reflect on how the course material has affected their ability to be an informed citizen of the world. The poster and poster presentation asks students to engage with current events from around the world and to apply course material to evaluate and describe the events.

Personal Responsibility (to include the ability to connect choices, actions and consequences to ethical decision - making):

Students will engage in several activities to meet the personal responsibility core objective, including: writing one reflection paper and engaging responsibly with teammates in the team activities. Reflection paper 2 asks students to reflect on their behavior in the course and to provide advice to future students; it also asks students to reflect on how the course material influences their perspective on how to be a responsible person. Additionally, students have team projects throughout the semester, which requires good teamwork. Students will evaluate, and be evaluated by, their teammates at two points during the semester. The evaluation includes: preparation, contribution, respect for others' ideas, and flexibility in working with others.
